MENU FOR EAST INDONESIA AID
and Ways You Can Help to Make a Difference

The list of projects below is indicative of the work done by the NTA and is based on specific requirements that have been or are being addressed.

I. ASSISTANCE FOR WATER SUPPLY SYSTEMS

- 1. Building a Well** *(including cement, sand, local expertise, skilled labour & transport of materials)*.....\$550
(Each well benefits 15 households, where each consists of 5 or more people).

- 2. Constructing a 15000 litre Off-the-Roof Ferro-cement Tank to Provide Sufficient Drinking Water for 5 Households***
(where ground water is too deep for well digging).....\$550

- 3. Constructing a Fibre Glass Tank for West Timor***
(only where building ferro-cement tanks is not possible due to soil conditions):
1,200 Lt *(drinking water for 1 month)*.....\$200
3,000 Lt Tank\$450

- 4. Water Reticulation on Semaui Island**
(Water Filter for Outlet Pipe from Water Source in Pool, to use in conjunction with existing scheme serving 140 households and 2000 cattle).....\$1,110

II. HEALTH AND SANITATION

- 1. One Household Toilet*** *(including cement for a closet & septic tank, and for a water tank to use in washing. Also including local transport)*.....\$111

- 2. A Set of Two Toilets for a School in Flores** *(including cement for a closet & septic tank, and for a water tank to use in washing. Also including local transport)*.....\$222

III. EDUCATION AND TRAINING

- 1. Training in Improved Teaching Methods for 70 Teachers from 12 Primary Schools in West Timor**
(4 days at Central Point & 1 day in each School).....\$5,197
- 2. School Library Training and Book & Shelf Provision for 11 Primary Schools in West Timor & Flores**.....\$5,432
- 3. On-the-spot Training in Crop & Livestock Management by separate visiting specialists**
4 days of training, Rp200.000/day x 4.....\$178

IV. INCOME-GENERATING ACTIVITIES

- 1. Capital for Hand-weaving Materials* for 10 women at Rp125.000 (or A\$27.80) each**.....\$278
- 2. Motor and Pump to Assist Irrigation of Cash Crops* (Motor [Petrol] & Pump Kit, including Inlet and Outlet Pipes)**.....\$778
- 3. Boat and Motor to Assist Harvesting of Seaweed***.....\$667

V. PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

- 1. Road Construction Work (per 100 metres of Road Improvement) for One Village in Flores**.....\$2,703
(This work is labour-intensive & consists of 'patching' steep, potholed roads. The residents of this village have been isolated, & deprived from basic health & market facilities. Despite people's repeated requests, the regional government's Public Works Department does not undertake activities in these areas).
- 2. Re-Roofing of 3 Classrooms for 1 School In West Timor (Replacement of Leaking Corrugated Iron Roof with New Corrugated Iron)**.....\$1,041
- 3. Complete Replacement of 3 Classrooms In West Timor (Original Classrooms Built of Leaves & Blown Down by Cyclone in April 2002)**.....\$7,484

VI. TRANSPORT & MAINTENANCE COSTS# of MOTOR CYCLES for 12 EXTENSION WORKERS

- 1. 4 Extension Workers in West Timor.....\$178**
- 2. 8 Extension Workers in Flores.....\$355**

VII. LOCAL EXPERTISE

- 1. Technical Advice, & Design and Supervision**
for WC's, School & Road Construction,
Off-the-Roof Tanks, etc for 6
months.....\$519**
- 2. Technical Advice, Provision of Medicines,
And Husbandry Training for Cattle & Pigs in Flores
(6 Annual Visits by 2 Livestock Specialists).....\$624**
